

MEMORANDUM TO ACADEMIC AND EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGE AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
INDIAN INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY BOMBAY, INDIA
AND
HIROSHIMA UNIVERSITY, JAPAN
FOR
IMPLEMENTATION OF DOCTORAL STUDENT AND RESEARCHER MOBILITY PROGRAM

In addition to the general terms of the Agreement on Academic and Educational Exchange signed between Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, India (IIT-B) and Hiroshima University, Japan as of Jan. 10, 2018, this memorandum lays down the general principles and some specific terms to promote mobility of doctoral students and researchers between the two universities.

Both universities have agreed as follows:

Co-supervision of doctoral students:

1. Both universities agree upon co-supervision of doctoral students.
2. Under the memorandum, a doctoral student shall conduct his/her research work under the co-supervision by two supervisors of the two universities, and the both supervisors are involved in the assessment of his/her work in progress.
3. The co-supervised student shall engage in the research work at the partner university for the duration of minimum four (4) months up to one (1) year. During the stay, the student will be registered in the both universities according to the terms and regulations to the respective universities.

Certificate for co-supervision:

4. The doctoral degree shall be awarded by the Home University following the rules and regulations for the thesis dissertation and degree award. The Host University

shall issue the co-supervised student a certificate, which indicates that the doctoral thesis was written under co-supervision by two supervisors at the two universities, signed by the representative of the Host University.

5. The contribution of the Host University should be acknowledged in the doctoral thesis in an appropriate manner.

Student status at the Host University:

6. At Hiroshima University, the co-supervised students shall be accepted with the status of Special Auditing Students or Special Research Students. At Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, the students shall be accepted with the status of co-supervised International Student.
7. The co-supervised students will not be subject to examination, admission, and tuition fees at the host university.

Number of visiting co-supervised students:

8. The Host University shall accept up to two (2) co-supervised students per academic year. Acceptance will be subject to the authority and discretion of the Host University.

Financial arrangement for co-supervised students:

9. The Home University shall provide the co-supervised students of Home University the cost of a round-trip airfare between India and Japan and appropriate financial support in accordance with its policy and rules.
10. The Host University shall assist the co-supervised students in finding suitable accommodation. Hiroshima University shall provide the students financial support for accommodation in accordance with its policy and rules. Indian Institute of Technology Bombay shall provide hostel accommodation for the students free of charge.
11. The co-supervised students are eligible for the financial support as stipulated in the

above provisions of Articles 9 and 10 only for once under this memorandum. However, all financial arrangement will depend on the availability of funds.

Mobility of researchers:

12. The both universities shall promote mobility of the supervisors of the doctoral students to motivate them to expand research and scholarly cooperation through joint supervision of doctoral candidates.

Number of visiting co-supervisors:

13. The Host University shall accept up to two (2) co-supervisors from the Home University per academic year. Acceptance will be subject to the authority and discretion of the Host University.

Financial arrangement for co-supervisors:

14. The Home University shall pay the co-supervisors of the Home University full or in part of the cost of a round-trip airfare between India and Japan in accordance with its policy and rules.
15. The Host University will provide the visiting co-supervisors on-campus accommodation, for up to one (1) week, preferably during the period of stay of the co-supervised doctoral students at the Host University. In case on-campus accommodation is not available, the Host University will assist them in finding suitable off-campus accommodation and cover the cost of their stay in accordance with its policy and rules.
16. The co-supervisors are eligible to receive such financial support as stipulated in the above provisions of Articles 14 and 15 for only once under this memorandum. All financial arrangement will depend on the availability of funds.

Responsible Office:

17. The processing for the exchange of students and researchers will be administered by the office of Dean International Relations at IIT Bombay and by International

Office at Hiroshima University.

Term of memorandum:

18. This memorandum shall commence on the day both parties have signed this memorandum and shall remain effective until March 31, 2022. This memorandum may be renewed at the end of the term upon mutual consultation. Both universities shall send written notice and consult one another at least six (6) months prior to revision or termination of this memorandum.




