

**AGREEMENT ON ACADEMIC AND EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGE
BETWEEN
INDIAN INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY BOMBAY, INDIA (IIT BOMBAY)
AND
HIROSHIMA UNIVERSITY, JAPAN**

Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, India (IIT Bombay) and Hiroshima University, Japan hereby agree to establish an academic and educational exchange agreement in order to promote mutual understanding between the two countries and between the two universities through educational and academic collaboration and exchange, and to contribute to the advancement and progress of learning.

Contents of the Exchange Programs

1. Both universities agree to cooperate in the following areas:
 - (1) Promotion of joint research
 - (2) Exchange of faculty members and administrative staff
 - (3) Exchange of undergraduate and graduate students
 - (4) Exchange of research outcomes, academic publications, and other academic information
 - (5) Other academic and educational exchange programs approved as suitable by both universities

Implementation of the Exchange Programs

2. The areas listed above shall be implemented following mutual consultation.

Term of the Agreement

3. This agreement shall become effective when the representatives of both universities sign below and shall remain effective for five years. The agreement shall be automatically renewed at the end of the five-year term unless one or both of the universities propose otherwise.

Revision and Termination of the Agreement

4. Both universities shall send written notice and consult each other at least one year prior to revision or termination of the agreement.

Language Used

5. This agreement shall be established in English and executed in duplicate, and each party shall retain one copy thereof respectively.

Compliance with the laws

6. All activities developed under this agreement must take place in compliance with all applicable laws, customs, regulations and standards of each university, its country and region.

Should any questions on any part of this agreement arise, both universities must consult with one another to find a solution.

**MEMORANDUM TO ACADEMIC AND EDUCATIONAL
EXCHANGE AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
INDIAN INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY BOMBAY, INDIA
AND
HIROSHIMA UNIVERSITY, JAPAN**

Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, India (hereinafter referred to as IIT Bombay) and Hiroshima University, Japan hereby agree to determine each item concerning the implementation of the undergraduate and graduate student exchange under the **“International Linkage Degree Program for Developing Innovators Transforming Advanced Technology to Social Goals”** (hereinafter referred to as “ILDP exchange students”), based on Article 1, Paragraph 3, of the Agreement on Academic and Educational Exchange which both universities concluded.

1. The number of ILDP exchange students visiting the host university for a period more than 1 (one) month shall not exceed 10 per academic year. Exchange students shall be permitted to stay at the host university no longer than one year.
2. ILDP exchange students will not be subject to fees for examination, admission, or tuition at the host university.
3. ILDP exchange students shall be given authorization and appropriate documents by the host university to apply for visas for the length of time equivalent to the exchange term in the country where the host university is located.
4. At Hiroshima University, undergraduate ILDP exchange students shall be accepted with the status of Special Auditing Students and graduate ILDP exchange students shall be accepted with the status of Special Auditing Students or Special Research Students. IIT Bombay, ILDP exchange students shall be accepted with the status of International Exchange Students. Selection of ILDP exchange students will be subject to the authority and discretion of the home university.
5. ILDP exchange students (excluding Special Research Students) may enroll in all courses (classes) offered by each university, except specific courses determined by the host university.
6. Both universities agree to endeavor to transfer credits earned by ILDP exchange students at the host university subject to their regulations and procedures.
7. Both universities shall endeavor to help exchange students to find appropriate housing.
8. ILDP exchange students must obtain insurance coverage for the exchange period as the host university requires. In case of a short visit less than one month, it is ILDP exchange students' responsibility to be insured for the entire period of their visit before leaving their home country.
9. Concerning the implementation of the exchange, particulars shall be discussed and agreed upon by both universities when necessary.

10. This memorandum shall commence on the day both parties have signed this memorandum and shall remain effective until March 31, 2022. This agreement may be renewed at the end of the term upon mutual consultation. Both universities shall send written notice and consult one another at least six (6) months prior to revision or termination of this memorandum. Students already admitted to and participating in the exchange program prior to such early termination shall be allowed to complete the program.
11. This memorandum shall be established in English and executed in duplicate, each party retaining one copy thereof respectively.
