

IIT Bombay is part of many consortiums and has been participating in and hosting the activities held under these consortiums. There were some activities carried out under these consortiums all in virtual mode in the past six months:

Sustainable Transportation System and Infrastructure (STSI)

STSI Program is an educational program jointly developed by Hokkaido University, IIT Bombay, IIT Hyderabad and IIT Madras, and aims at contributing to the development of human resources capable of playing roles in the promotion of teamwork research between Japan and India for Developing Sustainable Transportation system and Infrastructures.



Transportation system and Infrastructures. As the fifth year of the program progresses in a challenging situation with COVID-19, persons involved in STSI Program from Hokkaido University, Indian Institute of Technology Bombay, Hyderabad and Madras held Steering Committee Meeting 2022 online on 7th February 2022 to share and acknowledge overall achievements of five years of the program and current situation if participating universities, and discuss enhancement and transformation of the program starting as "One program for Global Goals (OGGs) - STSI Course" from the next fiscal year.

Asian Universities Alliance (AUA)

Asian Universities Alliance (AUA) is a consortium of Asian universities. It is a regional organization established with the aim of jointly addressing regional and global challenges, specifically related to higher education and economic, scientific and technological development by strengthening collaboration among member institutions. AUA was established with a core of 15 universities, with IIT Bombay being one of the founding member university of AUA. There are many activities and interactions that happen under this consortium among its member universities.

AUA Youth Empowerment Session: The AUA Youth Empowerment Session (AUAYES) 2022 themed on Empowering Asian Youth for a Better World, and held on 15th April 2022 had participation from AUA member university students who had participated in past programs of AUA. The students had discussion on the future of short-term student exchange programs and share their hopes and expectations for the next five years to continuously promote the building of a better AUA, and to contribute Asian wisdom to the development of global higher education. Three students from IIT Bombay participated in this session – Yatin Diwakar, Centre for Technology Alternatives for Rural Areas; Parth Laturia, Department of Computer Science and Engineering; Shubham Lohiya, Department of Mechanical Engineering.

AUA Presidents Forum: This forum brought together university leaders from across Asia to explore new approaches to higher education in responding to emerging challenges. Prof. Subhasis Chaudhuri, Director, IIT Bombay participated in one of the panel discussion of AUA Presidents Forum themed on "The Networked University for an Integrated"

Education and Research Ecosystem" held on 25th March 2022. The panelists openly shared their initiatives and experiences in creating an environment for integrated education and research through the optimization of institutional resources and by strengthening connections between academic units.

AUA Plenary Session and Board Meeting: From IIT Bombay, Prof. Subhasis Chaudhuri, Director, and Prof. Amit Agrawal, Dean International Relations, participated in the Plenary Session and the Board Meeting held on 22nd April 2022. The plenary session was themed on "Embracing Asian Diversity for a Shared Future: Mission of Universities in

Fostering a Community of Life for People and Nature", and the AUA member university leaders were invited to give thematic speeches on the theme of the plenary session and provide suggestions on the development of AUA, with the aim of integrating individual member's efforts into joint endeavors towards a better and shared future for people and nature. During the AUA Board Meeting, the major decisions related to the next AUA Executive Presidency, Financial Statements and Budget, AUA Program Proposals, AUA Themes 2023-2026 and others were taken. Also, Prof. Chaudhuri chaired one of the sessions on AUA review 2021-22 during the Board Meeting.

AUA Overseas Study Program on Artificial Intelligence in Education: Under the consortia Asian Universities Alliance (AUA), IIT Bombay - Office of International Relations and Interdisciplinary Programme in Education Technology (IDP-ET) hosted a short term program in online mode from 23rd May 2022 to 3rd June 2022 on "Artificial Intelligence in Education" for students of AUA member universities. Prof. Ramkumar Rajendran from IDP-ET conducted this program. This program provided an overview of how artificial intelligence techniques and machine learning algorithms can be applied to data from the educational domain to provide better teaching-learning experiences. This program had 23 student participants from 10 AUA member universities.

U7+

The U7+ Alliance of World Universities is the first coalition of university presidents aimed at defining concrete actions that universities can take to collectively address global challenges in coordination with government leaders in G7 countries and beyond.

U7+ Presidential Summit: The fourth annual U7+ Alliance of World Universities Summit of the Presidents, was held on 8th and 9th June 2022. Pursuing the commitments adopted on the eve of the 26th UN Climate Change Conference and in coherence with the multilateral agenda, this forth summit reflected on the role and the position of Universities in the development of smart and sustainable territories. This topic provided the opportunity for Presidents to share their views on the position of Universities within their local, national and global ecosystems while addressing the pressing challenge of training young and talented generations to face the current transitions. From IIT Bombay, Prof. Subhasis Chaudhuri, Director and Prof. Amit Agrawal, Dean International Relations participated in this summit.

Outreach Activities

Under this umbrella term many different activities are conducted by the Office of International Relations with the aim of promoting awareness and visibility of IIT Bombay around the globe. These activities showcase the capabilities that exist in IIT Bombay and we are hoping that this will help build our image as a 'world class research institute', and eventually attract good quality foreign students from different parts of the world into our programs at all levels. The following activities were conducted in the past six months and we are grateful for the support provided by IIT Bombay professors and their respective departments in helping us carry out these activities:

Participated in Japan India Exchange Platform Program (JIEPP): JIEPP is supported by the Japanese Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology and has a mission to develop a robust and sustainable platform for Japan-India exchange through the creation of a network to connect universities and companies currently engaged in Japan-India exchange projects. The 4th JIEPP Symposium was held on 24th February 2022 and it featured keynote speeches, presentations of results from each university and an overall discussion under the theme "Achievements and Prospects of the Japan-India Exchange Program by Universities." This symposium was hosted by The University of Tokyo, Japan and Prof. Amit Agrawal, Dean International Relations, IIT Bombay was invited as a keynote speaker at this symposium. Prof. Agrawal gave a talk on "Japan India Connect" covering the merits, achievements, expectations, and future prospects of the exchange with Japanese universities and IIT Bombay.




Summer Schools hosted by IIT Bombay on Carbon Capture Utilization and Sequestration

Summer Schools: The Office of International Relations feels delighted to share that it has accomplished successful completion of the first ever online Summer Schools in June/July, 2022. The program offered four interesting courses on current hot topics namely: Carbon capture utilization and sequestration, Data flow analysis, Introduction to numerical optimization and Advanced structural geology. The initiative presented the participants with great opportunity, not limited to study material distribution and developing understanding towards the courses but also offered one-on-one interactive and exciting session with globally renowned expert faculties of IIT Bombay. The Summer Schools 2022 contributed significantly to the vision of conducting such programs by showcasing the academic strength of IIT Bombay. The program faculty focused on making the lecture sessions more participatory by conducting quiz and feedbacks at different stages of their respective courses. We acknowledge the faculty of IIT Bombay for their contribution and conveying highly informative and insightful lectures. We are happy to share some of the images from the exciting course lectures conducted. Overwhelming number of applications with a total count of 571 were received from various countries around the globe including Sweden, Russia, Japan, Ethiopia, China, Brunei, Indonesia, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Uganda, Vietnam, Syria, Turkey and Bangladesh. The program was well structured following rigorous screening of applications by the faculty that raised the standards of the program. Noteworthy success of the consecutive program was observed reflecting a five-fold increase in the number of application compared to the first winter school. Encouraging feedback was received from the participants appreciating and looking forward to attending such programs organized by IIT Bombay. A good number of participants showed interest in taking further degree courses at IIT Bombay. Faculty members were also invited to submit feedback on this program with an aim to apply their suggestions for betterment of the program. Overall

the programs under this initiative presents promising outcome further extending the outreach activities of IIT Bombay and share the knowledge and ideas with the global student community. We are excited to prepare for the next winter school, 2022 and offer some of the advanced courses under the program.

Degree students enrolled in 2020 and 2021 who were unable to come to campus due to the COVID 19 pandemic were delighted to return when permitted.
